Workshop Abstract Submission Instructions

- 1. <u>Submission Deadline:</u> Workshop abstracts must be received by the deadline of **Friday**, **January 17**, **2025**.
- 2. <u>Organization of Workshop Session:</u> The 50 minute seminar session format will combine a short didactic component (<15 minutes) with time dedicated to facilitated discussion or activities to promote interactive learning among seminar attendees. Priorities will be given to submissions that feature synergy across more than one mission area (teaching, patient care, research, community engagement), interdisciplinary and interprofessional approaches, and/or include presenters/facilitators from more than one geographic site.

For the abstract, you will need to explain what the session will be about, the topic's relevance to family and community medicine, and describe how you will make the session interactive. Examples of the types of topics that might work well for a seminar include strategies for

integrating behavioral health or community medicine into training and clinical practice; tools for strengthening allyship in the face of microaggressions; proven methods for reducing clinician and trainee burnout; scope of practice and the meaning of being a "comprehensive" family doctor; how to successfully integrate advocacy work into diverse career paths.

- 3. <u>Abstract Length:</u> The maximum length of a workshop abstract submitted for the 2025 FCM Rodnick Colloquium is **800 words**.

IMPORTANT: Before you start submitting your abstract, please check to confirm (i.e., using Microsoft Word's word count tool) that the text of your abstract does not exceed 800 words (do not include title, authors, and section titles in your word count). This abstract submission program will allow you to enter more words than the limit, but if the text of your abstract exceeds 800 words, we will not be able to consider it.

- 4. **Presentation Format:** Workshops will be held only in person. The virtual option is only offered for posters and oral presentations.
- 5. <u>Title Listing:</u> Capitalize only the first word on your title. Please do not use abbreviations.
- 6. **<u>Author Listing:</u>** List authors in this format: Last Name, First Initial and Include an Asterisk (*) next to presenting/first author.
- 7. <u>Additional Abstract Submission Requirement:</u> At the end of the submission form, you must review and complete the following as part

of the submission process.
